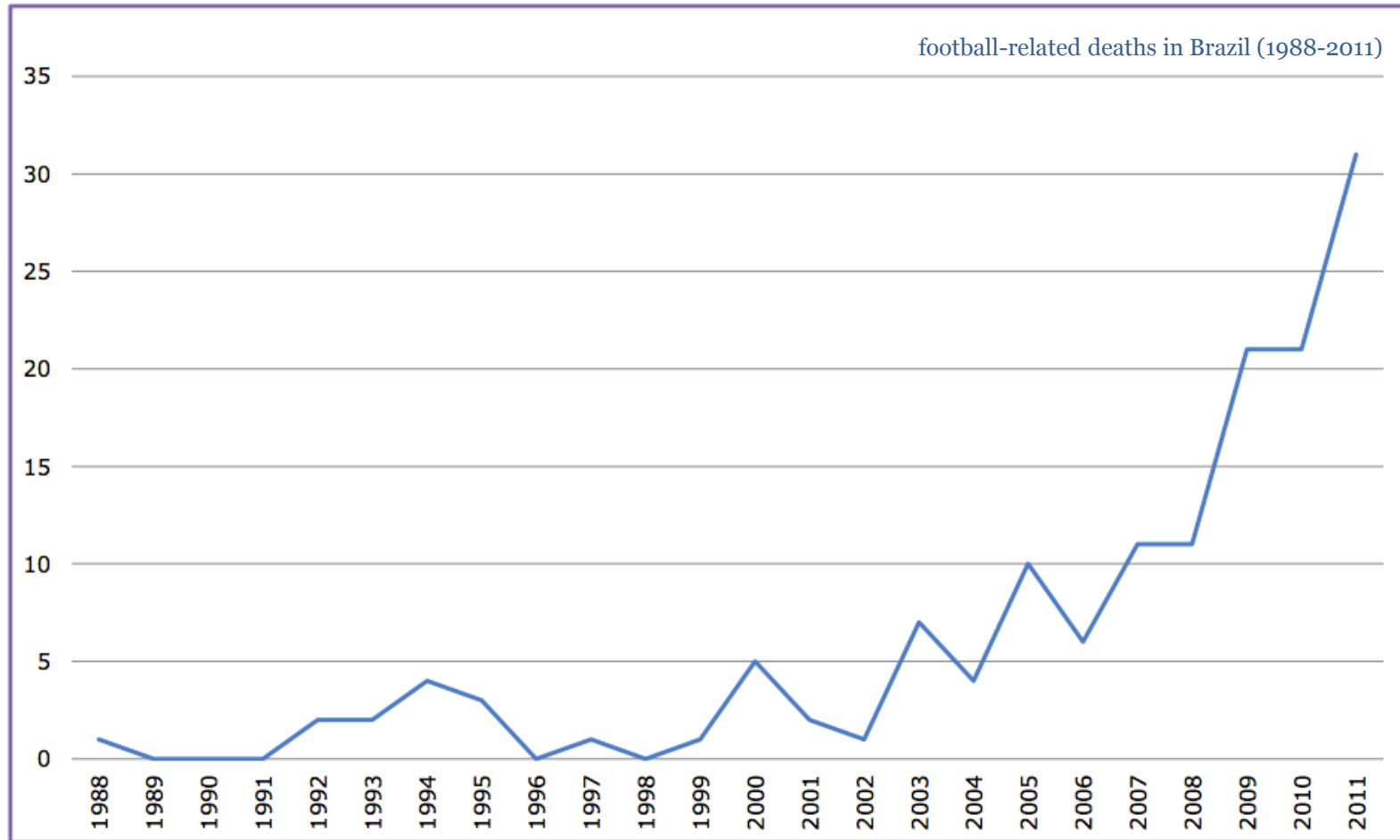

c) The Fan Statute (Law No. 10.671/2003, modified by Law No. 12.299/2010)

- (i) Application of the Consumer Protection Code;
- (i) Prohibition of alcohol consumption inside stadiums;
- (ii) Joint and several liability of the Public Authorities, Confederations, Clubs, Clubs managers and Organized Groups of Soccer Clubs;
- (iii) Tougher fines and penalties.

g) 30 deaths in 2013... And it could be worse...

25.08.2013 - Vasco x Corinthians

No victims, but Vasco and Corinthians forfeited the right to play at home **four** times each due to fan's fight.

06.10.2013 - Atlético-PR x Coritiba

No victims, but Atlético-PR and Coritiba forfeited the right to play at home **two** times each due to a confrontation with the Police.

17.10.2013 - São Paulo x Corinthians

No victims, but São Paulo forfeited the right to play at home **four** times due to its fan's fight. Both Clubs were also punished with fines of R\$ 80.000,00 and R\$ 40.000,00 respectively.

20.10.2013 - Goiás x São Paulo

Goiás fans fought among themselves for almost 10 minutes during the match, but the Superior Tribunal of Sports Justice (STJD) ignored it. No one was punished.

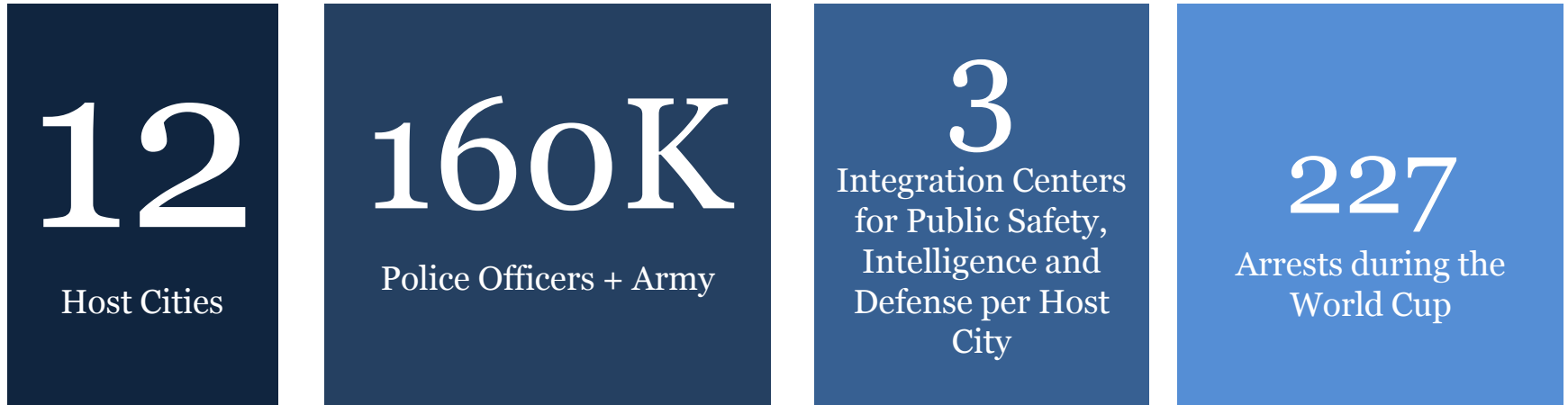
